The Sierra de Agreda, though not a real toponym in Nahuatl codices, became a symbolic axis mundi—a place where the celestial and terrestrial realms converged. Spanish colonizers, operating within a worldview where divine providence shaped history, interpreted these visions as evidence of the Virgin Mary's endorsement of the evangelization project. The descriptions of stepped pyramids, double-tiered temples, and communal rituals bear striking resemblance to postclassic Mesoamerican ceremonial centers like Teotihuacán and later Tenochtitlan, suggesting that the "city" was not a literal place but a symbolic synthesis. This fusion was not accidental: the Spanish colonial project relied on narrative construction to render conquest sacred, transforming resistance into divine mission. Agreda, then, became a mytho-political instrument, a spiritual mirror reflecting imperial ambition. Geopolitically, the Agreda myth gained momentum during the 17th and 18th centuries as Spain sought to consolidate control over its northern territories. The city's imagined location in the heart of New Spain—far from the coastal hubs vulnerable to foreign incursion—offered a symbolic counterweight to external threats. Jesuit and Franciscan missionaries propagated the legend not merely as devotion, but as a tool of cultural integration. By framing Agreda as a "city of God" rooted in local soil, they sought to supplant indigenous sacred sites with a Christianized version of Mesoamerican cosmology. This ideological repositioning had tangible economic consequences: land grants, tribute systems, and labor mobilization were increasingly justified through the lens of divine providence and sacred geography. The industrial and economic implications of Agreda's myth evolved significantly in the 19th and 20th centuries, particularly during Mexico's post-independence struggles. As the nation sought to define its identity amid liberal reforms and foreign intervention, Agreda resurfaced in nationalist discourse. Intellectuals like José María Luis Mora and later Alfonso Reyes wove the legend into broader narratives of Mexican exceptionalism, portraying it as a pre-Hispanic precursor to modern nationhood—a spiritual foundation beneath secular statehood. This reframing

elevated Agreda from a religious curiosity to a cultural archetype, influencing architecture, literature, and even state-sponsored tourism. Economically, the city became a site of symbolic capital. The geopolitical dimension persists in subtle forms. In contemporary Mexico, debates over cultural sovereignty and indigenous rights have reignited interest in alternative narratives of origin. Agreda, once a tool of colonial legitimation, is now invoked by some grassroots movements as a symbol of spiritual resilience—a counter-narrative to state-imposed histories. This reclamation challenges top-down interpretations, suggesting that the “city” may ultimately exist not in geography, but in collective memory. Looking forward, Agreda’s long-term implications hinge on how societies negotiate myth and history. In an era where authenticity is constantly questioned, Agreda reminds us that truth is often polyphonic—emerging not from a single source, but from the tension between vision and reality, belief and evidence, memory and myth. Its story, deep and enduring, continues to unfold, not as a closed chapter, but as an open inquiry into what it means to believe, to remember, and to build meaning across time.

Origins in Vision and Vicissitude: The Birth of a Myth

The genesis of Agreda lies not in maps or chronicles, but in a private spiritual experience—Ana María’s diary, dated 1640, opens with a moment of profound interiority.
