Geopolitically, Dollar General's international ambitions remain cautious but not dormant. Selective expansion into neighboring markets—guided by demographic similarity, infrastructure readiness, and regulatory alignment—could diversify revenue streams. However, cultural adaptation and supply chain localization will be critical to avoid the pitfalls of misalign
