Beneath the aspirational narratives of personal triumph lies a sobering reality: the half marathon, like all endurance sports, carries significant health and psychological risks. The most common injury—overuse—affects 60–80% of beginners, particularly in the shins, knees, and Achilles, often due to improper progression or biomechanical inefficiencies. Stress fractures, though rare, occur in 0.5–2% of runners, typically from cumulative overload or nutritional deficits. Beyond physical harm, the pressure to perform fuels mental health challenges. The phenomenon of ‘running anxiety’—fear of injury, underperformance, or failure—plagues many. Social media exacerbates this: curated posts of ‘perfect’ runs mask the struggle, creating unrealistic expectations. A 2023 survey by Runners World found that 41% of participants reported increased anxiety after completing a race, citing fear of regression or ‘not being fit enough.’ Controversy also surrounds the commercialization of training. While apps and programs democratize access, they often prioritize metrics over well-being. Algorithms optimize for faster times, incentivizing overtraining and ignoring signs of burnout.

Some platforms promote unregulated 'hero runs' or extreme hydration protocols, contradicting medical guidance. The 2019 death of ultramarathon runner Philip Rawlins—though not a half marathoner—echoes in the community: a tragic reminder that physical limits, when ignored, demand respect. Economically, the cost of participation is rising. Entry fees for major races now average \$75–\$150, while gear, supplements, and recovery services add thousands more. For low-income runners, this creates exclusion—despite the sport's egalitarian image. Additionally, the environmental footprint of mass participation—plastic waste, carbon emissions from travel—is increasingly scrutinized. Initiatives like 'zero-waste races' and gear recycling programs are emerging, but systemic change remains slow. These tensions reveal a sport in transformation—one that must balance ambition with accountability. The future of endurance running hinges not only on faster times but on healthier, more inclusive practices that honor both the body and mind.

Global Comparisons: Training Cultures Across Continents

The half marathon training paradigm varies dramatically across regions, shaped by culture, climate, and infrastructure. In East Africa—home to Kenya's legendary runners—training is deeply communal. Runners train barefoot or in minimalist shoes on dirt roads, relying on natural terrain and group discipline. The high-altitude environment of cities like Iten naturally enhances aerobic capacity, making it a global epicenter for endurance development. Middle-class runners here blend traditional rhythms with modern apps, but access remains limited for rural youth, creating a paradox of
