This contextual rigor extended to non-Western traditions. The entry on "Buddhist Epistemology," for example, contextualizes Madhyamaka logic not as a mystical curiosity, but as a sophisticated response to epistemological skepticism, engaging with contemporaneous developments in Indian Nyaya and Islamic falsafa. Such integration challenged the disciplinary boundaries that had long segregated "Eastern" and "Western" thought, forcing readers to reconsider philosophy as a global dialogue rather than a collection of

Edwards also insisted on critical engagement with problematic doctrines. Entries on totalitarian ideologies, colonial justifications, or gendered exclusions did not shy from ethical scrutiny. The treatment of Nietzsche's Nazi associations, for instance, avoided hagiography, instead analyzing how his thought was appropriated and distorted—a model of intellectual responsibility that resonated with scholars navigating sensitive historical legacies.

Expert Reactions: Admiration, Skepticism, and Debate

The academic response was mixed but deeply influential. Philosophers like John Searle praised the encyclopedia's ambition, calling it "a necessary antidote to the shrinking academic imagination." Others, including feminist theorists and postcolonial scholars, questioned whether the encyclopedia's editorial structure—still anchored in a hierarchical, citation-driven model—could fully accommodate marginalized voices. These critiques sparked internal reforms: the inclusion of more women philosophers, Indigenous thinkers, and LGBTQ+ theorists in subsequent revisions and digital supplements.

In non-Western academia, reactions were more ambivalent. In India, scholars welcomed the inclusion of Vedantic and Jain thought, yet some argued the framework remained overly shaped by Western analytic categories. In China, the encyclopedia was cited in university syllabi but largely treated as a
