Yet, not all returners are ideologues. Some are pragmatic entrepreneurs, skilled in negotiation, logistics, or finance. As former Colombian guerrilla leader Iván Márquez observed after peace talks: 'We return not to fight, but to build. Or to ensure that those who remain understand the cost of silence.' These perspectives reveal a spectrum: from ideological revivalists to technocratic rebuilders, each returning with a distinct agenda shaped by experience, trauma, and opportunity.

Controversies and Risks: The Dark Side of Return

But the return is not without peril. Governments often view returning adversaries with suspicion. In Tunisia, post-Arab Spring returnees from extremist groups have faced mass arrests, fueling cycles of radicalization.
