Moreover, the test's emphasis on English fluency risks disadvantaging gifted non-native speakers whose linguistic competence is undervalued in favor of native-speaker norms. This linguistic gatekeeping raises ethical questions about equity: is the OET a fair arbiter of skill, or a mechanism for cultural homogenization? Expert perspectives: voices from the frontlines Medical educators and language specialists offer divergent interpretations of the OET's role. Dr. Elena Marquez, a clinical linguist at the University of Melbourne, notes: 'The OET is not about penalizing non-native speech.
