Analyst Dr. Rajiv Mehta of the Global Literary Futures Initiative noted: “This isn’t just a new distribution method—it’s a redefinition of literary value. The book is no longer the endpoint, but a starting point.”

Geopolitical Undertones and the War for Narrative Authority

At its core, **The Monster** is a geopolitical text—one that situates American Black experience within a global framework of displacement, surveillance, and resistance. Myers never framed his work as parochial; rather, he positioned it as a node in a transnational network of marginalized storytelling. The monograph’s supplementary “Global Voices” section included testimonies from Syrian refugees, Indigenous Australians, and Venezuelan migrants—each rendered not as victims, but as agents navigating overlapping systems of control. This global lens was deliberate. In a 2023 lecture at the Paris International Writers Forum, Myers remarked: “The monster we fear is not the stranger on the street, but the system that makes you a monster by design.” He drew parallels to postcolonial theorist Achille Mbembe’s concept of “necropolitics”—the power to dictate who lives and who dies—arguing that modern surveillance states extend this logic through data, not just bullets. The digital platform amplified this by allowing cross-border contributions: a Nigerian youth’s post about police brutality could be read, commented on, and expanded by a Mexican activist’s account of state violence, all within the same narrative thread. Yet this cosmopolitanism sparked friction. In the U.S., some Black literary critics accused Myers of diluting authenticity by incorporating global voices into his American-centric canon. Others in Africa and the Middle East questioned whether a Black American author could ethically represent other marginalized experiences without co-optation. These debates reflected a deeper tension: in an era of identity politics, who controls the narrative, and how do we honor lived experience without appropriation? The project’s response was transparent. Myers co-authored a “Contributor’s Pact,” outlining ethical guidelines: anonymity for vulnerable
