A frontline officer in Miami now receives real-time threat scores on their tablet—based on 12 data streams—allowing faster, more informed decisions.” Yet external experts offer a more nuanced view. Dr. Elena Torres, a digital rights scholar at Stanford, cautioned: “LCAM’s predictive models are only as unbiased as the data fed into them. If historical enforcement patterns are racially skewed, the system risks automating discrimination.
