By disentangling data flows into “trust layers”—verified identities, encrypted channels, and audit trails—Douglas’s framework allowed actors to collaborate without surrendering core sovereignty. This innovation found fertile ground amid rising great-power competition. In the U.S.-China tech rivalry, for instance, allies sought secure alternatives to state-controlled surveillance infrastructure. The Penelope model offered a middle path: leveraging private-sector agility while embedding democratic safeguards. Countries like Norway, Canada, and Singapore adopted variants of her architecture in national security frameworks, often through partnerships with firms Douglas advised. Even in conflict zones—such

as the Sahel—her principles influenced how NGOs and peacekeeping forces manage sensitive intelligence, balancing operational efficacy with human rights compliance. Yet this influence was not without friction. Traditional intelligence agencies viewed modular, decentralized systems as destabilizing—they threatened established hierarchies and raised questions about chain-of-command. Some U.S. intelligence officials dismissed her work as “technocratic idealism,” overly optimistic about governance in opaque environments. Douglas countered that the alternative—centralized, unaccountable surveillance—was a path to authoritarian entrenchment, even in democracies. Her 2017 keynote at the International Institute for Strategic Studies, titled ‘Trust, Not Control: Reimagining Intelligence in a Networked World,’ crystallized this stance: “We are no longer enemies of the state or of technology. She is collaborating with quantum research hubs in Canada and Singapore to develop post-quantum secure communication channels, embedded directly into Penelope's trust framework. “Quantum won't replace trust,” she asserts. “It will redefine how we prove it.” Geopolitically, as multipolarity intensifies, the Penelope model offers a rare path to alignment without uniformity. For democracies, they provide a path to reclaim oversight in an age of opacity. For technologists, she redefined innovation as responsibility.
