This shift demands transparency, or risks authoritarian overreach masked as efficiency.” Legal scholar Prof. Luca Moretti adds: “The merit badge model reflects a neoliberal reimagining of citizenship—one where rights are increasingly tied to economic performance, undermining the moral foundation of civic equality.” Industry impact is equally significant. Multinational corporations, especially in tech and finance, are adopting internal citizenship frameworks to attract talent. Companies like Shopify, Revolut, and GitLab offer global employee pathways that blur national boundaries,

creating a parallel citizenship ecosystem. These platforms function as de facto arbiters of belonging, assessing candidates not by passport but by productivity, digital engagement, and alignment with corporate values. This trend pressures governments to adapt, lest they lose competitiveness in a talent economy where human capital flows faster than capital itself. In migration flows, the worksheet reshapes the experience of displaced persons. Meanwhile, AI-driven policy models may optimize citizenship allocation by balancing demographic needs, economic forecasts, and social cohesion metrics—raising both promise and peril.
