According to the Committee to Protect Journalists, over 400 journalists were imprisoned globally in 2023, many for exposing power. Legal scholars like Julie Cohen highlight the urgent need for updated legal frameworks: stronger whistleblower protections, anti-encryption backdoors safeguards, and international agreements on digital rights. Without such guardrails, the light remains fragile, vulnerable to suppression and exploitation. The labyrinth, she warns, grows deeper when legal systems fail to adapt. Controversies persist.
