Yet this data-driven precision clashed with entrenched labor realities. Retail workers, particularly those in part-time roles, often face unpredictable schedules, last-minute shifts, and limited notice—conditions exacerbated by algorithmic scheduling tools that prioritize corporate efficiency over worker autonomy. In D.C., where unions like RHFU have been active in advocating for labor rights, the Sw DC Hours became a flashpoint. Critics argued that while the hours appeared flexible on paper, they masked a deeper erosion of job security. When a 2022 investigation revealed that some workers received less than 24 hours' notice for evening shifts, public outcry intensified, prompting city officials to demand transparency in scheduling algorithms and greater worker input. This practice, while not explicitly prohibited by federal law, drew condemnation from the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB), which cited violations of Section 8(a)(1) of the National Labor Relations Act, protecting workers’ right to collective bargaining and fair scheduling. Her testimony helped galvanize support for legislative reforms, including proposed D.C. laws mandating “predictable shift windows” and requiring explicit opt-in consent for non-standard hours.
