Globally, the model adapted to local contexts. In Brazil, it was integrated into community centers to counter urban violence through youth empowerment. In Finland, where PE is a cornerstone of national education, it became a vehicle for fostering “phenomenal learning”—where movement stimuli trigger deeper inquiry. In post-conflict regions like South Sudan, it served as a tool for reconciliation, using shared physical goals to build trust across ethnic lines. The word “volleyball” itself, once a neutral sport, now carried symbolic weight—representing connection, rhythm, and collective purpose.

Geopolitical and Economic Context: Soft Power, Public Health, and Fiscal Realities The rise of this model cannot be divorced from global geopolitical currents. The World Health Organization's 2018 call for 60 minutes of daily physical activity for children coincided with UNESCO's push for PE as a human right. In low-income nations,

where non-communicable diseases now rival infectious ones in burden, PE became a cost-effective public health intervention. Moreover, international development agencies increasingly viewed such programs as vehicles for soft power.
