In Germany, where leather craftsmanship is protected under cultural heritage laws, open-source holster patterns are tolerated only when explicitly disclaimed from liability. In the United States, the Supreme Court’s 2022 decision in *New York State Rifle & Pistol Association v. Bruen* has indirectly empowered challenges to regulations affecting “custom firearm-related equipment,” emboldening advocates of free pattern sharing. Meanwhile, the European Union’s proposed Firearms Directive revision includes provisions targeting digital blueprints, sparking debate over whether such restrictions constitute overreach or necessary public safety measures. He speaks not in terms of profit, but of lineage: “Each stitch, each cut, echoes the hands that came before—from the saddlers of the Western frontier to the rebels in the shadows. This is not just leather. It’s memory, movement, and meaning folded into a single form.” In an age of digital anonymity and state surveillance, the free leather holster endures as a tangible act of resistance—quiet, enduring, and profoundly human.
