By 2023, this program had reached over 400,000 students in underserved municipalities, demonstrating that scalable impact requires more than product design—it demands ecosystem collaboration.

Comparative studies with traditional Indian music schools reveal striking contrasts. While institutions like the Sangeet Natak Akademi emphasize rote mastery of ragas, Faber's focus on improvisation and creative expression attracted a younger, more diverse cohort—particularly girls and children from non-elite backgrounds—who found traditional methods alienating. This suggests a broader shift: music education's future may lie not in a single orthodoxy, but in pluralistic models that honor

both tradition and innovation.
