Similarly, Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) states, flush with petrodollars and ambitions in fintech and green finance, have embraced the Accord’s transparency clauses as a gateway to

Western markets and ESG investment pools. The United States, initially skeptical of supranational frameworks, has selectively adopted key components—particularly in anti-money laundering (AML) and cross-border data sharing—through executive orders and agency guidance. This partial embrace underscores a broader trend: the Accord is not a monolithic imposition but a negotiated ecosystem. Contrast this with Professor Rajiv Nair of the Indian Institute of Technology, who cautions against overconfidence. "Standardization reduces friction, but it risks homogenizing governance models that should reflect local contexts," he warns. "A one-size-fits-all template may obscure cultural, legal, and political nuances—especially in jurisdictions with weaker institutional capacity. The real test is not adoption, but adaptation." Industry leaders offer a more pragmatic take. Sectors like green finance stand to benefit most: standardized ESG reporting templates could unlock trillions in sustainable investment by lowering greenwashing risks. Strategically, the Accord signals a shift from power politics to “governance economics”—where influence derives not from military might or market size, but from control over shared systems.
