In Ukraine, post-2014 reforms sought to dismantle such structures, but entrenched networks persisted, linking oligarchs to offshore trusts that obscured ownership of strategic assets. The International Consortium of Investigative Journalists (ICIJ) estimates that over \$30 trillion in offshore wealth is held in secrecy jurisdictions—many connected to El Jarrón Azul’s operational logic—representing nearly
