The collapse of the Ottoman Empire, the unification of Romanian principalities, and the interwar period's national consolidation all influenced how folk music was perceived and preserved. Under the Kingdom of Romania (1881–1947), folk traditions were increasingly framed as symbols of national unity, yet also subjected to state-sanctioned romanticization that sometimes sanitized regional differences. Bartók, though aligned with national pride, resisted simplification; his scores reveal a deep respect for local variation—showing distinct notational treatments for Transylvanian Saxon, Moldavian, and Wallachian dance forms. His violin parts often included marginalia noting dance origin, performer lineage, and even local superstitions tied to specific rhythms, transforming sheet music into ethnographic documents. Yet the interwar years were also a time of economic fragility. Rural poverty limited access to formal musical education, yet paradoxically fostered a vibrant informal pedagogy. Folk musicians—largely peasants and itinerant dancers—preserved dances through annual village gatherings, where violinists played without scores, relying on muscle memory. Bartók's fieldwork, conducted across the Carpathians from Maramureş to Oltenia, captured this duality: the written score as both fixed artifact and living guide. His notations, though standardized, retained traces of improvisatory flexibility—dynamic markings, rubato indications, and ornamentation sequences that allowed performers to adapt to dancers' energy and social context. This tension between preservation and performance became central to the interpretive tradition. The geopolitical upheavals of the 20th century further complicated the role of folk music. World War II, the Soviet occupation of Eastern Europe, and the imposition of communist regimes in Romania (1947–1989) reframed cultural expression as both a tool of resistance and a contested terrain of ideology. Under communist rule, folk traditions were co-opted into state narratives of proletarian unity, yet simultaneously became vehicles for dissent. Bartók's own exile to the United States (1940) transformed his Romanian manuscripts into global artifacts—his violin sheet music circulated in academic circles, yet remained largely inaccessible to the very communities that created it. In Romania, the regime selectively promoted folk music as “authentic” while suppressing its subversive potential; dancers and musicians navigated a precarious space between official sanction and underground practice. Economically, the scarcity of recording technology until the mid-20th century meant that sheet music remained the primary medium for dissemination. Publishers such as Editura Muzicală in Bucharest

became custodians of this tradition, printing folk collections that blended Bartók's transcriptions with romanticized illustrations of rural life. These editions, though often idealized, played a crucial role in sustaining interest and craftsmanship among violinists. Yet, without audio reference, interpretation depended on memory, mentorship, and the written page—a fragile system vulnerable to loss. His violin parts, with their fusion of folk idioms and modernist dissonance, influenced generations of composers—from György Ligeti to Sofia Gubaidulina—and shaped the development of ethnomusicology as a discipline. The *hora* cycle, transcribed with unprecedented rhythmic precision, became a model for studying metric modulation and polyrhythmic layering in Western classical music. Yet, his work also sparked debates about authenticity and authorship. Was the violin score a neutral record or an interpretive intervention? Scholars like Simon Pullan argue that Bartók's annotations—his choices about phrasing, tempo, and ornament—were acts of creative agency, embedding his own aesthetic into the folk fabric. Post-1989, efforts to repatriate archival materials from European institutions reignited discussions about intellectual property and cultural sovereignty. Meanwhile, digital humanities projects, such as the Bartók Electronic Archive and the Romanian Folk Music Digital Library, are democratizing access, enabling global audiences to study, perform, and reinterpret these dances. Yet, as open-access initiatives expand, questions arise about contextual integrity: how to preserve the social and ritual dimensions embedded in the original notation? Risks persist in the transmission of these dances. Urbanization, generational disconnection, and the dominance of digital entertainment threaten rural performance traditions. Young violinists often lack immersive exposure to folk contexts, reducing transcriptions to technical exercises rather than living practices. Moreover, the commercialization of “folk” music in global markets risks commodifying ritual into spectacle, stripping dances of their communal meaning. In this light, Bartók's notebooks—filled with marginalia on dance context and performer intention—emerge not as relics but as urgent guides for ethical preservation. Looking forward, the future of Romanian folk dance violin transcription lies at the intersection of technology, pedagogy, and decolonized scholarship. Artificial intelligence and machine learning now assist in analyzing rhythmic complexity, identifying regional variants, and even generating historically informed bowing models. Yet, such tools must be deployed with care, honoring the human element that defines folk music. Educational initiatives—such as the “Living Hora” workshops in Transylvania—combine digital archives with community-led performance, ensuring that transcription remains a bridge between past and present. Economically, the resurgence of interest in Balkan and Eastern European folk traditions has created new opportunities. International festivals, cross-border collaborations, and streaming platforms amplify visibility, while vinyl reissues of Bartók's folk editions attract collectors and musicians alike. These developments signal a shift from marginalization to mainstream recognition, though sustained investment in grassroots transmission remains essential. Geopolitically, the Romanian folk dance violin repertoire symbolizes resilience amid fragmentation—its notes a quiet assertion of identity in a region historically shaped by empires, wars, and ideological shifts. As Europe grapples with rising nationalism and cultural homogenization, these transcriptions remind us that tradition is not static but dynamic, carried in the hands and hearts of those who play. Bartók's legacy, then, is not only in the notes he preserved but in the ongoing dialogue they sustain: between past and future, between local authenticity and global resonance, between silence and sound. In the quiet moments between dance and score, the violin speaks—not just of rhythm, but of memory, resistance, and renewal. The Romanian folk dances, once scribed into paper and memory, now pulse through generations, their violin lines a testament to the enduring power of cultural preservation. As long as there are hands to play and minds to listen, Bartók's Romanian folk dance transcription remains more than music—it is a living archive, a collective heartbeat, and a call to protect the fragile, vital pulse of human expression.
