Strategically, the path forward demands systemic reform. Labor unions in Bangladesh and India are pushing for “stitchers’ charters”—collective agreements guaranteeing safe conditions, fair pay, and creative recognition. Meanwhile, brands like For Days and Pact are experimenting with “living wages” models, where stitchers receive equity shares in the garments they produce—aligning profit with purpose.
