A 2023 study by the International Hydraulic Fluid Association found that hydraulic fluid costs now account for up to 18% of total maintenance expenditure in high-performance industries. A prolonged supply disruption—whether due to geopolitical instability or raw material shortages—could trigger cascading failures, especially in critical infrastructure like nuclear cooling systems or offshore drilling rigs.

Controversies, Risks, and the Shadow of Dependency

Despite its technical merits, NH 134 is not without controversy. Environmental advocates critique its biodegradability: while superior to older mineral oils, NH 134 remains petroleum-based and not inherently eco-friendly. Biodegradable
