Far from a static liturgy, this stotra has undergone centuries of transformation, shaped by dynastic patronage, colonial suppression, post-independence ideological battles, and the current resurgence of religious nationalism. Its journey reflects not only the sanctity of a divine figure but also the contested terrain of identity, power, and representation in the 21st century. Origins: The Cosmic Battle and Vedic Roots The Durga Devi Stotra traces its textual lineage to the early medieval period, though its thematic core draws deeply from the Vedic and post-Vedic cosmology of the goddess as a cosmic warrior (Devi Shakti). The earliest references to Durga as a singular, militant deity emerge in the Shakta Upanishads and later in the Devi Mahatmya (also known as Durga Saptashati), composed between the 4th and 6th centuries CE. Colonial Erasure and the Suppression of Sacred Language The 19th century marked a rupture in the stotra's unbroken continuity. British colonial rule, driven by a civilizational hierarchy that framed indigenous religions as superstitious and backward, systematically undermined Sanskrit and ritual practices. Colonial administrators and missionaries dismissed devotional texts like the Durga Devi Stotra as primitive fetishes, actively discouraging public recitation in favor of Anglicized Christian liturgy and secular education. This suppression was not merely cultural but epistemic. The colonial state dismantled traditional patronage systems—temples, gurukulas, and royal courts—that had sustained sacred literature. Sanskrit, once the lingua franca of intellectual discourse, was marginalized in favor of English, severing intergenerational transmission. The stotra, surviving primarily in manuscript form among oral lineages and temple priests, became a relic of a pre-modern past—its authority reduced to folklore rather than theological significance. Yet, within this erasure, quiet resistance persisted. Hidden in private recitations, encoded in folk songs, and preserved by women's devotional circles, the hymn endured. This underground continuity laid the groundwork for its post-independence revival.
