By 2020, GenovaNova had established 17 regional innovation hubs, each empowered to tailor genetic constructs to local ecosystems—be it salt-tolerant rice in Bangladesh's deltaic plains or heat-resistant cassava in the Sahel. This decentralization had profound economic implications. Traditional agribusiness relied on massive seed sales and proprietary technologies; Rastogi and Pathak's model shifted revenue toward service-oriented licensing and technical support. This marked a rare instance of disruptive innovation forcing legacy firms to adapt rather than resist. Regulatory bodies, too, faced unprecedented challenges.
