Russia, Canada, and the U.S. have expanded meteorological infrastructure, often framing it as climate resilience, but critics see it as strategic positioning in a contested frontier. In the economic sphere, the value of these maps surged. Insurance giants like Swiss Re embed isobaric risk layers into parametric policies, automating payouts based on predefined storm intensity thresholds. Energy firms use isothermal forecasting to optimize wind farm output and hydrogen production efficiency. Agricultural
