In regions with weaker state presence, informal networks often override formal checkpoints, reinforcing segregation between regulated and unregulated mobility zones. The global comparison reveals Turkey's approach as emblematic of middle-income states navigating rapid urbanization and institutional transition. In India, for instance, vehicle inspections are fragmented across states,

with varying standards and digital adoption. In Brazil, the *IPVA* system combines annual checks with regional variability, often plagued by evasion. China, by contrast, has implemented highly centralized, tech-driven inspection regimes using facial recognition and blockchain, achieving near-universal compliance but raising privacy concerns. Turkey's model, while less advanced, shares with these systems a tension between control and flexibility—between uniformity and local adaptation. Long-term implications are profound. As electric vehicles (EVs) surge globally, the CHP checklist faces obsolescence in form and function. Battery safety, charging infrastructure, and software integrity demand new inspection parameters—areas where Turkey lags behind EU leaders who now require EV-specific diagnostics. The checklist's future hinges on its ability to evolve from a static form into a dynamic, adaptive system—one that integrates cybersecurity, sustainability metrics, and real-time data analytics. Strategically, the CHP vehicle inspection checklist exemplifies the state's struggle to balance sovereignty with globalization. It is a microcosm of how technical standards become battlegrounds for authority, equity, and modernity. For policymakers, the lesson is clear: compliance is not automatic. Positioned at the crossroads of Europe and the Middle East, Turkey's automotive sector has long served as both a domestic industrial pillar and a strategic node in regional trade. The CHP's role evolved not merely as a technical enforcer but as a geopolitical actor—mediating between national sovereignty, EU integration pressures, and the realities of informal cross-border commerce. The 1987 association agreement with the European Union marked a turning point. As Turkey sought

deeper accession, harmonizing vehicle standards became non-negotiable. Euro 4 emissions norms, mandatory safety features, and standardized documentation were not optional upgrades—they were prerequisites. The CHP, tasked with enforcement, inherited a dual mandate: to align with international benchmarks while managing a domestic landscape rife with legacy vehicles, informal trade, and uneven infrastructure. This tension persists—Turkey’s vehicle fleet is a mosaic of Euro 2 to Euro 6 models, with tens of thousands of older, high-emission vehicles still on the road. Economically, vehicle inspections function as both gatekeepers and revenue generators. The CHP collects fees tied to inspections, registration renewals, and compliance certifications—critical income in a state where public trust in institutions is uneven. Yet, compliance costs disproportionately burden small operators: a family-owned delivery business in Diyarbakır may face bribes to avoid inspection denial, while a large logistics firm with dedicated compliance teams navigates the system efficiently. This disparity fuels a shadow economy where unregistered vehicles circulate at scale—estimated by the Turkish Road Transport Federation to constitute nearly 25% of urban traffic in major cities. This informal sector undermines not only safety but fiscal equity. A 2022 study by the Economic Policy Research Foundation of Turkey found that unregistered vehicles contribute an estimated €1.2 billion annually in lost tax revenue—funds that could otherwise support infrastructure or public services. The CHP’s checklist, therefore, is as much an instrument of fiscal policy as safety regulation. Yet, its effectiveness is hampered by under-resourced stations, inconsistent enforcement, and digital fragmentation. Paper-based systems dominate smaller municipalities, increasing

opportunities for corruption and error. The rise of electric mobility introduces both disruption and opportunity. Turkey's EV adoption, though nascent compared to Europe, is growing—supported by government incentives and global supply chains. However, the CHP's current checklist lacks EV-specific diagnostics: battery integrity, charging compatibility, and software security. As the EU pushes for carbon-neutral transport by 2050, Turkey's vehicle inspection framework risks obsolescence unless it integrates these new standards. The CHP's pilot digital platforms offer a pathway—but scaling them requires investment, training, and public-private collaboration. Globally, Turkey's approach reflects a broader trend among middle-income states: balancing rapid urbanization with institutional capacity. In India, vehicle inspections vary by state, creating a patchwork of enforcement. Brazil's *IPVA* system, while decentralized, uses regional cooperation to reduce evasion. China's centralized, tech-driven model achieves near-universal compliance but at the cost of surveillance. Turkey's path, by contrast, is one of incremental reform—digitizing the checklist, expanding data integration, and testing new inspection protocols for EVs. The CHP's evolution mirrors Turkey's broader struggle with modernity: how to maintain state authority while fostering inclusive growth, how to enforce rules without alienating citizens, and how to align with global standards without sacrificing local realities. The vehicle inspection checklist, once a bureaucratic form, now stands as a microcosm of these tensions—small in form, but vast in implication.

Industry Impact and Stakeholder Dynamics: The CHP Checklist in Practice

These mechanics, often self-employed with limited oversight, face a dilemma: conduct thorough inspections and risk losing clients to cheaper, unscrupulous competitors, or cut corners to maintain their customer base.
