Its modernization parallels, such as the revival of Welsh or Maori, share themes of cultural resilience, yet differ in scale and institutional support. The third edition's standardized model offers a case study in how language policy can shape national identity—particularly in post-colonial or post-diaspora contexts. Looking ahead, the primer's legacy is being re-evaluated in an era of digital transformation.
