In contrast, post-Soviet states such as Estonia and Latvia adopted OI/OY-centric literacy reforms after regaining independence, viewing phonics as a tool to rebuild national identity and educational sovereignty. These programs were integrated with digital platforms, allowing for adaptive worksheets that responded to student performance—blending Soviet-era discipline with 21st-century innovation. The result was a notable rise in literacy rates, though critics argue such reforms inadvertently marginalized minority languages and minority communities.
