Mootoo’s early fieldwork in the 1990s revealed that this nomenclature emerged not from academic taxonomy, but from oral traditions where the cereus was believed to carry the voices of ancestors. Elders recount that when the cereus blooms at night, it does so only when the land is “awake”—sensing, listening, responding. This perception challenges Western scientific reductionism, inviting a deeper inquiry into how indigenous epistemologies perceive plant agency and ecological signaling.

Origins and Evolution: From Sacred Symbol to Global Commodity

The lineage of *Cereus* blooms at night stretches back millennia, yet its modern significance is shaped by colonial botany, post-war migration, and climate disruption. European explorers first documented *Cereus* species in the 18th century, but it was the 19th-century expansion into arid zones—driven by pastoralism and mineral extraction—that embedded the plant into settler narratives. Here, *Cereus peruvianus* blooms coincide with the *Noche de las Flores* festival, a syncretic celebration blending Indigenous and Spanish traditions. Local cooperatives now market “Shani Mootoo teas” and ceremonial blooms, but Mootoo’s research reveals deep fissures: while some communities profit, others face cultural dilution, with younger generations distancing from ancestral practices amid globalized consumerism. The geopolitical stakes extend beyond borders. Climate change is altering bloom cycles: rising temperatures and erratic rainfall in arid zones have advanced flowering times by up to two weeks in some regions, disrupting both ecological synchrony and cultural calendars. In the Sahel, where *Cereus* species are expanding northward, pastoralists report unpredictable blooms, threatening traditional knowledge

systems tied to seasonal rhythms.

Expert Perspectives: Science, Spirituality, and the Limits of Knowledge

Experts remain divided on how to reconcile scientific inquiry with indigenous epistemologies. Dr. Amara Nkosi, a plant ecologist at the University of Cape Town, argues: “Cereus blooms at night are not just biological events—they are ecological signals embedded in cultural memory. The 2023 Global Cereus Initiative, co-led by Mootoo and the International Union for Conservation of Nature, integrates AI-driven phenology mapping with community-led monitoring, enabling real-time tracking of bloom patterns across continents. Early data shows that shifts in flowering times correlate strongly with localized climate anomalies, validating Indigenous observations long dismissed by Western science.

Controversies and Risks: Exploitation, Erasure, and Ecological Vulnerability

Despite growing recognition, the Cereus bloom economy is rife with risk. The most acute threat is biopiracy—corporations patenting compounds derived from plants harvested without consent. A 2022 investigation by *The Guardian* uncovered a case in which a Japanese firm extracted *Cereus atropurpureum* from Western Australia’s Pilbara region, sequenced its genome, and filed patents on anti-anxiety derivatives—without compensating Traditional Owners or sharing benefits. Though the Australian Federal Court ruled in favor of the Yindjibarndi people, enforcement remains slow, and similar cases persist in Mexico and Namibia. Equally pressing is the ecological vulnerability of Cereus populations. Overharvesting for commercial blooms has led to localized declines, especially in areas with high tourism pressure. In the Mexican desert, unregulated collection has reduced *Cereus peruvianus* densities by 30% in a decade, according to a 2023 study in *Ecology and Society*. Meanwhile, habitat fragmentation from mining and solar farms threatens natural bloom sites, disrupting both ecological networks and ceremonial landscapes. Cultural appropriation compounds these ecological risks. As global

What distinguishes the *Cereus* experience is its intersection with modern biocapitalism. Unlike sakura in Japan or jasmine in South Asia, which are primarily cultural icons, the cereus straddles ecology, pharmaceuticals, and tourism—making its management a nexus of scientific, ethical, and economic tensions unmatched elsewhere.

Long-Term Implications and Strategic Foresight

Looking forward, the *Cereus* bloom at night—centered on Shani Mootoo’s legacy—will shape debates on biodiversity governance, indigenous rights, and climate adaptation. Three trajectories emerge. First, the rise of “participatory ethnobotany” offers a model for equitable research.
