Yet amid the precarity, resilience flourishes. Community-led initiatives demonstrate remarkable innovation. In Surat, youth volunteers retrofitted a derelict factory with open-air learning pods shielded from dust and heat. These projects are not just about bricks and mortar—they are about reclaiming dignity. As one student in Dharavi put it: ‘We study under the same roof where our fathers worked. It’s not perfect, but it’s ours.’ International comparisons illuminate the scale of India’s challenge. In Brazil’s favelas, “escolas de rua” (street schools) operate in repurposed storefronts and community centers, supported by municipal programs integrating informal learning into official curricula. In South Africa’s townships, post-apartheid reforms have attempted to retrofit informal settlements with modular schools, though funding gaps persist. In contrast, India’s approach remains fragmented, reliant on NGO intervention rather than systemic policy.
