But it was the 2010s, driven by data science and machine learning, that elevated five in a row from anecdote to analytical artifact. Teams began tracking not just outcomes, but the conditions under which dominance occurred: pace of play, opponent strength, home-field advantage, and even weather variables.

The list became a proxy for systemic dominance, a metric that transcended individual performance to reflect organizational coherence. Overreliance on five in a row as a success metric risks crowding out diversity and innovation—systems optimized for continuity may resist disruptive change. The 2020–2022 dominance of fossil fuel

utilities in European energy markets, briefly sustained by regulatory inertia, delayed the clean transition, proving that sustained performance without adaptation leads to obsolescence. Looking forward, the "beyond five in a row" paradigm demands a new analytical maturity. It requires distinguishing between statistical dominance and systemic resilience, between momentum and momentum's decay. Analysts must integrate behavioral economics, institutional theory, and complex systems science to avoid reifying sequences as destiny. The future lies not in chasing five in a row, but in understanding how to sustain excellence without becoming its prisoner.
