Public institutions hollowed out, unions weakened, and precarious labor became normalized. In this vacuum, groups once embedded in industrial or communal life—unemployed youth, rural migrants, ethnic minorities, gig workers—began to feel not just economically displaced, but narratively erased. Their stories were absent from national discourses, their experiences reduced to data points in efficiency reports. The script emerged as a counter-narrative: a dramaturgical excavation of what happens when entire populations become unrecognizable to the dominant storylines of progress. In the Arctic, Indigenous youth use augmented reality installations at international forums to narrate melting ice not as environmental data, but as ancestral memory.
