The earliest inscriptions referencing kathakal performances date to the 9th century, carved in stone at temples like Padmanabhaswamy and Guruvayur, depicting scenes of divine narratives enacted by priestly families. These were not mere entertainment but ritual acts, part of yajnas and utsavams designed to reenact cosmic order (dharma) through dramatized myth.
