In Latin America, where collective trauma from dictatorship and displacement runs deep, it has been integrated into community healing circles, reinforcing its role as a social as well as individual tool. In contrast, in countries with restrictive mental health policies—such as parts of the Middle East or Eastern Europe—its adoption often occurs through underground networks, reflecting both its subversive power and systemic barriers. Looking forward, the workbook’s long-term implications are profound. As artificial intelligence and biofeedback technologies advance, future iterations may incorporate real-time physiological data—heart rate variability, galvanic skin response—to personalize exercises, enhancing precision and responsiveness. Yet this technological integration must be approached with care: the body’s wisdom lies not only in measurable signals but in its qualitative, lived dimension. process rooted in presence, embodiment, and connection. Moreover, its influence extends beyond individual recovery to societal transformation.
