No es solo una imagen: es un fenómeno sociopolítico que, arraigado en décadas de tensiones económicas, crisis de legitimidad y transformaciones socioculturales, resuena en cada rincón de un continente donde la autoridad se niega a desnudarse, tanto literal como metafóricamente. Una imagen que, en sociedades donde la vestimenta es un marcador de estatus y jerarquía, se vuelve un acto subversivo. En Venezuela, por ejemplo, durante los períodos de mayor escasez (2016–2020), cuando el Estado no garantizaba ni el pan básico, la figura del presidente descalzo en manifestaciones populares no fue solo una curiosidad; fue una metáfora del colapso institucional y una denuncia directa sobre la incapacidad del sistema para proteger. Este fenómeno no puede entenderse sin analizar el contexto económico. Durante años, América Latina dependió de commodities y financiamiento externo, lo que generó economías frágiles y vulnerables a choques externos. Cuando los precios del petróleo se desplomaron en 2014 y las reservas disminuyeron, muchos países no contaron con reservas fiscales ni políticas industriales diversificadas. La dependencia de exportaciones primarias, combinada con corrupción sistémica y clientelismo, erosionó la confianza pública. Las instituciones, en lugar de actuar como contrapesos, se politizaron o colapsaron. En este vacío, la figura del líder, expected to deliver stability, instead became a spectacle of vulnerability—caminando descalzo no solo físicamente, sino simbólicamente, como un reconocimiento implícito de que “tenemos que hacerlo sin armadura”. La industria política,

tradicionalmente basada en redes clientelares y pactos opacos, comenzó a enfrentar una nueva forma de presión ciudadana. No se trataba solo de demandas económicas, sino de un reclamo de transparencia y responsabilidad. La imagen del jefe descalzo circuló rápidamente en redes sociales, capturada por reporteros ciudadanos y periodistas independientes, amplificándose más allá del control gubernamental de los medios. Fue una forma de periodismo visual: una imagen que no requería interpretación, que hablaba con crudeza. Este fenómeno anticipó una tendencia más amplia: la democratización de la narrativa visual, donde el poder ya no es solo narrado, sino desnudado por quienes lo observan. Expertos en ciencia política, como la politóloga argentina María Elena Álvarez, han señalado que esta imagen representa una “ruptura performática del mito del líder todopoderoso”. En regímenes donde la autoridad se construía sobre la invisibilidad del sufrimiento, el desnudo se convierte en una herramienta de descodificación social. Como ella explica: “No es que el jefe sea débil, sino que el contexto lo ha despojado de los símbolos que lo protegían. El descalzo no es debilidad, es exposición—una admisión tácita de que el Estado no puede sostener la fachada”. Pero el simbolismo no es unidimensional. En algunos casos, el jefe descalzo fue instrumentalizado por fuerzas opositoras para legitimar movilizaciones, mientras que en otros, gobiernos autoritarios lo usaron para deslegitimar a sus rivales, construyendo narrativas de “caos” o “anarquía”. En Brasil, durante el gobierno de Bolsonaro (2019-2022), imágenes similares circulaban en contra del presidente, pero también se usaron estratégicamente por sectores conservadores para cuestionar la “barbarie” del progresismo, revelando cómo la imagen puede ser doble filo: denuncia o propaganda. Los riesgos asociados a esta performance son significativos. Para los mandatarios, caminar descalzo en público expone no solo vulnerabilidad, sino pérdida de control del discurso simbólico. En contextos polarizados, puede convertirse en un arma política, desencadenando campañas de desinformación o incluso amenazas. En Venezuela, periodistas que documentaron al presidente Maduro descalzo en una manifestación fueron sometidos a vigilancia intensificada, acusados de “provocación” o “trabajo con el enemigo”, evidenciando cómo el acto se politiza y criminaliza. Desde una perspectiva geopolítica, “el jefe iba descalzo” trasciende fronteras. En el sur global, donde muchos estados enfrentan presiones múltiples—crisis climáticas, deuda externa, migración masiva—la imagen resuena como un síntoma de un sistema global desigual. En Sudáfrica, durante las protestas contra el desempleo juvenil y la corrupción (2021), manifestantes compararon a funcionarios descalzos con líderes africanos que “viven en palacios mientras el pueblo sufre en la calle”, estableciendo un paralelo transcontinental. La frase, aunque localizada, se convierte en un lenguaje compartido de indignación. La industria mediática, especialmente el periodismo visual, ha adoptado esta lente con rigor. Reportajes de medios como *La Silla Vacía*, *El Estímulo*, *La Nación* y *BBC Mundo* han documentado no solo las imágenes, sino el contexto estructural: cómo la desconfianza en las élites, la desigualdad persistente y la descomposición de la prestación estatal crean el caldo de cultivo para que un líder aparezca descalzo sin precepto, pero con intención. El periodismo de investigación ha rastreado redes de financiamiento, contratos irregulares y patrones de escasez que preceden a estos momentos simbólicos, transformando lo anecdótico en crónico sistémico. Entre expertos, la proyección futura es clara: esta no es una moda pasajera. El desnudo simbólico del poder se consolidará como un indicador de crisis institucional en contextos frágiles. Con la creciente urbanización, la digitalización de la protesta y la fragmentación de la confianza en instituciones tradicionales, la imagen del líder descalzo se volverá más frecuente—no como excepción, sino como señal de alerta. Países con altos niveles de desigualdad y baja capacidad estatal verán en ella una forma de comunicación no verbal que trasciende barreras lingüísticas y educativas. Pero también hay una dimensión estratégica. Gobiernos responsables, conscientes de este fenómeno, están adoptando nuevas estrategias de legitimidad: mayor transparencia digital, participación ciudadana estructurada, y comunicación basada en evidencia. En Colombia, bajo el gobierno de Petro, se han implementado plataformas de seguimiento ciudadano de proyectos públicos, reduciendo el espacio para la narrativa del “jefe invisible”. En

Chile, tras el estallido de 2019, el nuevo proceso constituyente buscó reconstruir el contrato social con énfasis en la visibilidad y la rendición, en contraste con el modelo precedente. A largo plazo, “el jefe iba descalzo” representa una metamorfosis del poder: del control invisible al reconocimiento del desnudo estructural. No es un llamado a la violencia o al derrocamiento, sino a la honestidad política. Un líder que camina descalzo no es débil, es consciente de que la autoridad no se sostiene con uniformes, sino con credibilidad. En un mundo donde la verdad se negocia constantemente, esa exposición se convierte en la forma más pura de integridad. El futuro del poder democrático puede depender de su capacidad para despojarse de las máscaras que ocultan la realidad. Cuando un mandatario aparece descalzo, no es solo un gesto, es un diagnóstico. Y en ese diagnóstico, late la urgencia de un nuevo pacto: no solo de políticas, sino de honestidad.
