Released in late 2013, the DVD package was meticulously curated: it included not only the feature film but also three feature-length companion episodes (*The Doctor Falls*, *The Time of the Doctor*, *Heaven Sent*), behind-the-scenes documentaries, and a curated selection of audio commentary by the cast and crew. This bundling strategy reflected an industry-wide shift toward “value packaging,” where films were no longer standalone products but entry points into extended narratives and fan communities. From a distribution perspective, the DVD release exemplified BBC Studios’ aggressive transmedia strategy. While streaming platforms like Netflix and Amazon Prime were beginning to disrupt traditional windows, the physical medium retained significance in key markets—particularly the U.S., where *Doctor Who* had developed a fervent cult following—and in regions with high per-capita home entertainment spending, such as parts of Europe, Australia, and East Asia. Controversies centered on casting: Tennant's popularity was universal, but some critics dismissed the film as overly reliant on nostalgia.
