In the U.S., advocacy groups highlighted how Ados 2’s emotional inference modules risked reinforcing algorithmic bias—penalizing users with neurodivergent patterns or cultural communication styles as “lower engagement” or “high risk.” Beyond commercial applications, Ados 2 influenced public policy.
