This aligns with broader movements for open science and decolonized curricula, positioning her not just as a theorist but as a strategic architect of epistemic change. Globally, Harding's influence is evident in the growing prominence of Southern feminist epistemologies. Scholars in India, Nigeria, Brazil, and Indonesia now cite her work as foundational to their own methodological innovations, adapting her principles to local struggles against patriarchy, extractivism, and authoritarianism. Her concept of "weak objectivity"—the provisional, revisable stance grounded in humility—resonates in contexts where absolute certainty is both impossible and dangerous. In post-conflict societies, for instance, her framework supports truth-telling processes that honor survivor testimonies without demanding finality, allowing memory to remain a living, contested terrain. Looking ahead, the long-term implications of Harding's feminism and methodology are transformative. As artificial intelligence and algorithmic governance increasingly shape public life, her insistence on situated knowledge offers a vital counterweight to the myth of neutral technology. Algorithms trained on biased datasets reproduce and amplify existing inequalities; Harding's call for epistemic reflexivity urges technologists and policymakers alike to interrogate data sources, design choices, and power dynamics embedded in computational systems. Her work thus prefigures critical data studies and calls for "decolonial AI"—systems that recognize and correct for historical injustice rather than automating it. Moreover, in an age of resurgent authoritarianism and epistemic crises—from climate denial to disinformation—Harding's methodology provides a blueprint for

democratic knowledge production. By centering marginalized voices and embracing pluralism, her approach strengthens civic epistemologies: ways of knowing that are inclusive, contestable, and oriented toward justice. This is not merely academic; it is essential for building resilient, equitable societies. Yet challenges persist. Institutional inertia, funding structures that favor conventional research, and the ongoing dominance of Western epistemic norms continue to constrain the full realization of her vision. Moreover, as global inequalities deepen, the risk of co-optation grows: feminist insights may be diluted into “diversity” metrics without substantive change. Harding’s legacy, then, demands vigilance: a commitment to methodological rigor not as dogma, but as a living practice of resistance and renewal. In the final analysis, Sandra Harding’s feminism and methodology represent more than a theoretical contribution—they are a call to reimagine the very purpose of knowledge. She teaches us that to know is to act, and to act is to be accountable. In a world fractured by inequality, war, and ecological collapse, her work remains an indispensable compass: one that honors complexity, honors silence, and above all, honors the voices too long unheard.
