This instrumentalization risks reducing spiritual depth to partisan tools, undermining the text’s transformative potential. Ethically, the industry must balance accessibility with accuracy. Initiatives like the Bible Society’s “Truthful Trivia” project—partnering with scholars to vet questions—represent a model. Similarly, academic institutions are integrating critical trivia into courses, teaching students to ‘question not just the facts, but the context.’ This approach fosters informed engagement rather than rote memorization. ****Long-Term Implications and Strategic Foresight**** Looking ahead, Bible trivia is poised to evolve with digital and societal shifts. Augmented reality (AR) apps will enable immersive biblical timelines—visiting ancient Jerusalem while answering location-based questions on architecture, trade, and scripture.
