Though internal audits later confirmed issues, the incident underscored the fragility of trust in an industry where reputation is currency. More recently, lawsuits from disgruntled breeders and racing teams have challenged the stud's monopoly on genetic validation, arguing that entry barriers stifle competition and innovation.
