Epigraphic studies reveal that inscriptions—often in Pali or Classical Thai—record the reigning monarch's name, the occasion, and

the artisan responsible. One 16th-century mask, discovered in Wat Phra Kaew's archives, bears the signature of a royal goldsmith, indicating state oversight of production. These artifacts thus function as material narratives, encoding political intent and spiritual authority in gold and jade. Contemporary forensic analysis, including isotopic testing and electron microscopy, has confirmed that many masks were deliberately aged, their patinas meticulously crafted to mimic antiquity. During Myanmar's 2021 coup, several high-grade masks vanished from private Thai collections, later reemerging in Hong Kong auctions under new provenance claims. Auction houses, once eager participants, now conduct forensic audits, requiring XRF scans and blockchain-backed certificates. Yet enforcement remains fragmented.
