Defenders counter that these actions were responses to existential threats, operating within the moral universe of 7th-century geopolitics. The debate reflects broader scholarly tensions: how to evaluate religious movements through contemporary ethical lenses without erasing historical context. The

risks Muhammad faced were profound and existential. Betrayal, assassination attempts, and prolonged persecution tested his resilience. The boycott of the Hashimite clan (617–623), a sustained social and economic siege, nearly extinguished the nascent community.
