This reflects a broader cultural preference for relational trust over digital metrics. Africa’s emerging market offers yet another model. In Nigeria and Kenya, startups like Tujio and Muziki use SMS-based verification and local community hubs to build trust, recognizing limited digital infrastructure and high mobile penetration. These platforms rely on “trusted messengers”—local influencers or community leaders—to authenticate profiles, blending digital tools with traditional social capital. These regional differences underscore a fundamental truth: trust format is not universal. It is deeply embedded in local values, infrastructures, and power dynamics.
