This not only deprives communities of care but strains existing EMTs, who absorb new recruits and face increased workload. The 2020–2022 pandemic exacerbated this: with surge demand, many agencies reported understaffing despite high pass rates, suggesting that certification alone does not ensure retention or resilience. Technological dependence introduces further vulnerabilities. The shift to digital, adaptive testing platforms has improved efficiency but also exposed disparities in internet access and device ownership—particularly among

rural EMTs and those in shift-based roles. During periods of system outages, candidates face delays or cancellations, undermining the exam’s reliability. Cybersecurity concerns, too, loom large: a 2023 breach attempt on the state’s exam portal threatened candidate data and institutional trust, highlighting the need for robust digital safeguards. Ethically, the guide’s emphasis on rigid protocols raises questions about clinical judgment.
