The rise of digital platforms fragmented audiences and eroded trust in institutional journalism, but Cosmo adapted by cultivating niche, high-impact narratives that demanded attention through depth rather than speed. His 2015 series "The Market for Belief" dissected how religious content had become a commodified asset—monetized through social media algorithms, subscription models, and corporate partnerships. This investigation revealed how megachurch networks, evangelical think tanks, and even tech giants leveraged spiritual narratives to capture attention and shape public opinion, often blurring ethical boundaries between evangelism and influence. Cosmo's methodology is rooted in what scholars call "narrative cartography"—a systematic mapping of belief systems, their alliances, and their material stakes. He treats religion as a form of soft infrastructure, invisible in policy papers but palpable in protests, elections, and cultural movements. His team integrates ethnographic fieldwork with data analytics, tracing funding flows, analyzing digital footprints, and interviewing actors across the religious spectrum—from grassroots pastors to corporate CEOs.
