Their survival depended on mobility: seasonal migration, hidden valleys, and alliances with nomadic pastoralists. This adaptability became their defining trait. Unlike the rigid hierarchies of Mesopotamian city-states, Hurin society thrived in ambiguity—between village and empire, tradition and innovation. Their resilience mirrors that of the Ainu in Japan or the Berbers of North Africa—communities redefining identity amid
