These constraints reveal the yearbook's vulnerability as a site of dissent. Globally, comparative analysis shows striking variations. In Finland, they celebrate curiosity and self-discovery: "Curiosity is your compass." In Brazil, amid rising youth activism, messages frequently invoke social justice: "You are the change." These differences reflect national educational philosophies and cultural narratives, proving the yearbook's deep embeddedness in local context. Looking ahead, the yearbook is poised for fundamental transformation. Artificial intelligence tools now assist in drafting personalized messages, raising questions about authenticity. Blockchain-based digital credentials may enable verifiable, student-controlled yearbook archives, challenging institutional ownership. Meanwhile, virtual reality yearbooks could offer immersive, multi-sensory reflections, merging memory with innovation. Yet the core remains unchanged: a teacher's handwritten or thoughtfully composed message is an intimate act of witness, a testament to belief in a student's capacity to grow. Strategically, the yearbook's future lies in democratization. Empowering students as co-

authors, integrating interdisciplinary narratives, and linking archives to lifelong learning platforms can reinvigorate its relevance. Initiatives like the UNESCO Yearbook Initiative, launching in 2024, aim to create global, multilingual digital repositories that preserve diverse teacher voices while safeguarding privacy and equity.
