The U.S. led in therapeutic approvals and AI-driven drug discovery; China pursued large-scale population genomics and synthetic biology; the EU tightened regulatory scrutiny under the “precautionary principle.” In this landscape, India’s emergence as a biotech contender was both strategic and contested. India’s “Biotechnology Vision 2030” aimed to position the country as a global leader in affordable, scalable genetic therapies. Rastogi’s GenoVive became a cornerstone of this vision—its low-cost CRISPR platforms adopted across public hospitals in rural states. Yet, this growth coincided with rising scrutiny of China’s bioengineered initiatives, particularly in gene editing for agricultural and human applications. Western governments, wary of technological dependency, began incentivizing “friend-shoring” of biotech supply chains. Rastogi navigated this terrain with caution: her lab avoided dual-use technologies with military applications, and she championed multilateral collaboration over proprietary control. Economically, genetic engineering redefined value chains. Patents once dominated by a handful of U.S. firms fragmented as open-source platforms emerged. Rastogi’s advocacy for “commons-based innovation” challenged the patent treadmill, arguing that monopolistic control over life forms exacerbated global inequities. Her influence extended to policy: she advised the Indian Ministry of Health on drafting the Genetic Resources (Access and Benefit-Sharing) Rules, ensuring indigenous communities retained rights over their biological heritage.

Yet, economic pressures persisted. Venture capital firms, drawn to the sector’s growth, pushed for rapid scaling. Rastogi resisted premature commercialization, famously rejecting a \$300 million acquisition offer from a U.S. biotech giant in 2021. “We are not selling life,” she told *The Hindu* at the time. “Our mission is to heal, not to harvest.” This principled stance underscored a broader crisis in biotech: the tension between mission-driven science and investor capitalism. Rastogi’s model demonstrated that impact and sustainability need not be mutually exclusive—but required unwavering institutional support and public trust.

Expert Perspectives: The Ethics of Intervention

Scholars across disciplines have scrutinized Rastogi’s contributions through diverse lenses. Geneticist Dr. Nila Sen, from the University of Cape Town, frames her as a “moral architect” of equitable genomics. “Rastogi refuses the narrative that genetic progress is inevitable or neutral. She centers justice, demanding that technology serve the many, not the few,” Sen observed in a 2023 interview. “Her work challenges the myth of scientific neutrality, insisting that every edit carries social meaning.” In contrast, bioethicist Dr. Luca Moretti of the University of Geneva raises nuanced concerns. “While Rastogi’s commitment to equity is commendable, the global rollout of her therapies risks replicating historical patterns: local communities contribute data but rarely benefit from downstream profits. The ‘open’ model is fragile without enforceable governance.” Moretti notes that many African nations lack regulatory capacity to negotiate fair benefit-sharing

agreements, leaving them vulnerable to exploitation even within equitable frameworks. Sociologist Dr. Amara Patel adds a cultural dimension. “Rastogi’s success lies in her deep engagement with local epistemologies—understanding that genetic diseases manifest differently across populations. But this requires humility, not paternalism. True equity means co-creation, not consultation.” She cites GenoVive’s participatory design process in Odisha, where tribal elders co-developed informed consent protocols rooted in oral traditions, not Western legalistic forms. Economist Dr. Rajiv Desai analyzes the scalability of her model. “GenoVive’s tiered pricing and open licensing are innovative, but systemic change demands broader reform. Patent laws, funding structures, and international treaties must evolve to support decentralized innovation. Rastogi’s greatest legacy may be not her therapies, but the institutional shifts she catalyzed.”

These voices converge on a central insight: Rastogi’s impact transcends science. She has redefined the terms of engagement in genetic engineering, embedding ethics, equity, and sovereignty into its core. Yet, the path forward remains fraught with structural imbalances—between Global North and South, between public good and private gain, between innovation and accountability.

Controversies and Risks: The Shadow of Double-Use and Mistrust

No figure in genetic engineering operates without controversy. Rastogi’s work has drawn scrutiny from multiple fronts. Critics within India’s regulatory apparatus have accused GenoVive of “delaying progress” by insisting on rigorous, community-led clinical trials. Rastogi, then speaking at the International Summit on Human Genome Editing, warned: “We must not allow fear to paralyze progress, but we must never weaponize it to legitimize unchecked ambition.” Her call for a permanent global moratorium on heritable edits found support among many scientists but remains politically divisive. Bioweapon concerns, though speculative, linger. The dual-use potential of CRISPR—capable of both curing and harming—has long haunted the field. While Rastogi’s therapies are strictly therapeutic and non-transferable, her openness about foundational research invited suspicion. She responded by co-authoring a white paper with the International Institute for Strategic Studies, outlining rigorous oversight mechanisms and advocating for a global registry of genetic engineering projects with dual-use risks. Moreover, cultural resistance persists. In conservative communities, genetic modification is sometimes conflated with hubris or

even heresy. Rastogi's insistence on culturally sensitive engagement—learning local languages, respecting spiritual beliefs, and involving religious leaders—has mitigated this, but not eliminated it. In rural Uttar Pradesh, a pilot program initially met with resistance until local imams endorsed the therapy as consistent with Islamic principles of healing.

These challenges reflect deeper tensions: the gap between technical possibility and societal readiness. As gene editing becomes more precise, so too does public awareness—and skepticism. Rastogi's career is, in part, a testament to the difficulty of aligning scientific ambition with democratic deliberation.

Global Comparisons: Rastogi's Model in Context

Japan offers another contrast. With its aging population and shrinking workforce, Japan has invested heavily in regenerative medicine and anti-aging genetics—largely driven by corporate R&D with limited public input. Rastogi's community-engaged model counters this technocratic top-down approach, emphasizing participatory governance. Similarly, Brazil's bioethics councils have advanced indigenous rights in genetic research, echoing GenoVive's principles but within a different legal framework. Emerging nations like Nigeria and South Africa are experimenting with their own frameworks. South Africa's Genome Initiative, inspired in part by GenoVive's Commons model, seeks to build sovereign biobanks managed by local scientists and communities. Nigeria's National Biotechnology Development Agency has adopted Rastogi's tiered licensing, enabling affordable access to CRISPR tools in public health programs. These adaptations reflect a growing demand for sovereignty in genetic narratives—one Rastogi has actively championed.

Yet, no country yet fully replicates her vision. The structural barriers—intellectual property regimes, venture capital incentives, and geopolitical asymmetries—remain formidable. Rastogi's greatest contribution may be proving that ethical innovation is not

only possible but scalable when rooted in justice and community agency.

Long-Term Implications: The Future of Genetic Governance

As genetic engineering matures, its societal footprint deepens. Rastogi’s work foreshadows a paradigm shift: from genetic medicine as a commodity to a shared human heritage requiring collective stewardship. The rise of synthetic biology, AI-driven design, and gene drives will accelerate this transformation, demanding new governance models.
