The second pillar, “Writing the Argument,” demanded synthesis under pressure. Students produced essays responding to complex prompts, synthesizing up to three sources into a coherent, evidence-based claim. The 2023 rubric placed heightened emphasis on “strategic organization”: the ability to

pivot between summary, analysis, and rebuttal, and to tailor tone and style to audience expectations. The essay section, now fully digital but still graded on human judgment, introduced a “textual interplay” criterion, rewarding writers who acknowledged counterarguments not as distractions, but as rhetorical leverage.
