The 1999 sale of his catalog to Bantam Books—a move driven by the consolidation wave in publishing—marked a turning point, reflecting how authorial legacy became a commodified asset. His later works, particularly post-9/11, reflect a nation in existential reckoning. *The Road* (2006) is not merely a zombie apocalypse; it is a geopolitical thriller mapping the collapse of global institutions, the fragility of international

cooperation, and the dehumanizing logic of contagion. Written as a series of oral histories, the novel leverages real-world data—epidemiological models, military logistics, refugee flows—to render the unthinkable plausible. Its structure, mimicking journalistic reportage, blurs fact and fiction, challenging readers to confront the blurring line between fiction as warning and fiction as prophecy. Similarly, (2011) revisits the JFK assassination not as historical puzzle but as meditation on memory, regret, and the illusion of control. Set in a parallel 1980s Maine, the novel juxtaposes 1960s Texas with a present-day New England, interrogating how individual choices reverberate across time. The protagonist, Jake Epping, embodies King's recurring figure: the ordinary man thrust into extraordinary circumstances, struggling to prevent catastrophe without asserting total agency. The novel's global resonance lies in its treatment of truth—how history is constructed, manipulated, and ultimately unreliable—a theme with acute relevance in post-truth eras. King's portrayal of American regional identity is both a strength and a point of critical scrutiny. His fictional Maine, often rendered as a rugged, isolated backwater, functions as a cultural microcosm. Translated into over 40 languages, his novels have found devoted readerships from South Korea to Brazil, each adapting his themes to local anxieties. In Japan, (1983) resonates with post-atomic trauma and Shinto-inflected fears of ancestral restlessness; in Eastern Europe, (1978) finds echoes in Cold War narratives of ideological siege and spiritual rebirth. Yet King's voice remains distinctly American—rooted in small-town realism, vernacular dialogue, and a mythic sense of fate. From a literary theory perspective, King's oeuvre challenges genre hierarchies. While initially dismissed by highbrow critics as “lowbrow,” his work has been increasingly analyzed through critical lenses: psychoanalysis (trauma, repression), cultural studies (collective memory, mythmaking), and political theory (power, resistance).
