In the United States alone, the market for fluoride

supplements, mouthwashes, and fortified products exceeds \$2 billion annually. Nagel's challenge directly threatens this infrastructure. By diagnosing decay as a symptom—not a cause—of nutritional imbalance, he undermines the scientific legitimacy of fluoridation as a primary intervention. This has positioned him at odds with major public health institutions, including the CDC and the American Dental Association (ADA), which maintain that fluoride remains “one of the 10 great public health achievements of the 20th century.” Yet the critique extends beyond institutional inertia. The fluoride industry benefits from long-term contracts, regulatory capture, and deeply embedded messaging that equates water fluoridation with dental health. Nagel's work, though marginalized by mainstream science, resonates in regions where fluoridation is either absent or culturally resisted—such as parts of Europe, where political and ethical concerns over “mass medication” have limited adoption. This tension reflects a broader geopolitical divide. In the U.S. and some Commonwealth nations, fluoridation remains state-enforced; in much of Western Europe, it is banned or voluntary. In countries like Germany and Sweden, where dietary patterns emphasize fermented dairy, organ meats, and cod liver oil, natural caries rates remain low—aligning with Nagel's ethnographic data. They argue that fluoride alone cannot reverse advanced decay but remains effective as a preventive agent when combined with dietary remineralization. This shift has catalyzed new product lines—such as pH-balanced oral care regimens, K2-enriched supplements, and artisanal fermented tooth pastes—targeting consumers disillusioned with industrial dentistry. The economic implications are significant. If Nagel’s model gains traction, demand for fortified foods, nutrient-dense supplements, and personalized dietary planning could surge, disrupting the fluoride-centric supply chain. Moreover, public health funding models may shift from fluoridation infrastructure to community-based nutrition education and preventive dentistry.
