Yet, local adaptations reveal tensions: in regions with less rigorous quality control, a spreadsheet's precision becomes a promise rather than a guarantee. Globalization further complicated the landscape. Multinational developers often bypass local codes, importing ACI-compliant bolts and spreadsheets to ensure interoperability across project phases. This practice, while efficient, risks creating a dual system—formal, code-compliant infrastructure versus informal, code-bypassed construction. In megacities like Lagos, Jakarta, and Mumbai, this duality manifests in skyscrapers with structurally sound cores but compromised anchor points, where spreadsheets are referenced only in design offices, not on-site. The result is a fragmented reality: strength encoded in spreadsheets, but performance variably realized.

The Expert Lens: Engineers, Regulators, and the Human Factor

Interviews with structural engineers reveal the spreadsheet as both a trusted ally and a source of stress. Dr. Elena Marquez, a senior structural engineer at a Mexico City high-rise firm, described it as 'the bridge between code and construction': 'The spreadsheet forces you to articulate every assumption—load, environment, material—before steel is cut.
